


Charles and Karen Short Veterinary Pharmacology Scholarship


DVM Student Research Award

Anna Jolles and Brianna Beechler conducting a retrospective cohort study in a herd of wild African buffalo with naturally occurring bovine tuberculosis (BTB). The other was with the National Institute of Health under Dr. Constance Noguchi, section chief of the Molecular Cell Biology Section for the National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney Diseases, concerning the effects of erythropoietin injections on skeletal muscle fibers, both in wild type mice and myoglobin knock out mice.




Carolina Cabaret Memorial Scholarship




E. E. Wedman Outstanding Senior Award




Award for Proficiency in Emergency & Critical Care sponsored by the Veterinary Emergency & Critical Care Society (VECCS)


Graduate Student/House Officer Awards




