2025 Rules, Conditions, & Information for Teaching Grants

Faculty members are encouraged to submit original proposals **dealing with relevant topics of research in teaching of veterinary medicine**. Collaborative, multi-disciplinary proposals will receive special attention and consideration. Only one project will be funded per faculty.

Grants are available to support up to 2 proposals at \$ 3,000 each for one fiscal year. If any proposals involve a multi-year study, it will be considered as such (up to \$6,000).

All funds must be used within the fiscal year (July 1, 2025-June 30, 2026). No funds should be carried over; they need to be used by the end of the academic year.

Application Deadline: March 3, 2025 (5:00 P.M. Pacific Time) [with notification by June].

- 1. Any faculty member, independent of rank, may apply for support.
- 2. Only one (1) proposal per PI will be funded during any given funding period.
- 3. Multidisciplinary proposals involving Co-PIs in Biomedical Science and Clinical Science departments will receive special attention.
- 4. The grant funds can support salary and supplies but <u>cannot</u> be used for travel expenses. (Salary CANNOT be used for someone who already receives 100% salary on 1.0 FTE)
- 5. Review Process: The proposals will be reviewed by the CCVM Research Committee. Members of the Committee who are not expert in all subjects and, therefore, may consult an outside reviewer.
- 6. If the research requires IRB or IACUC review, funds will only be awarded AFTER the approval
- 7. The proposal should be a maximum of 3 pages long (NOT including Cover Page, Budget, Budget Justification, References), or 4 pages if Preliminary Results are included.
- 8. Font should be no smaller than 11 point (Fig. captions can be 10 pt.); use ½ inch margins.
- 9. The grant application is to be submitted as a single PDF file, consisting of (in this order):

A. GRANT APPLICATION COVER PAGE

B. BUDGET PAGE:

Grant budget guideline:

The maximum award for this year is \$6,000 [if more funds are needed please justify]

- i. Requested budget is realistic for the completion of the proposed project objectives
- ii. Cost for budgeted line items are accurate and reasonable
- iii. Justification for requested budget clearly explains the necessity of expected costs and expenses

C. PROPOSAL OUTLINE (3-page limit):

- i. Hypothesis and Objective(s)
- ii. Background/Relevance
- iii. Preliminary Data, if applicable (1 page maximum)
- iv. Experimental Design and Methods

D. REFERENCES (2 page maximum)

- 12. The awardees must provide a **Final Report**, which includes accounting, on the research at the end of the funding period (**report is due by July 31, 2026**).
